St Benedict Biscop C.E. Primary School Remote Learning Plan

In order to ensure that learning is continued, irrespective of lockdown and self-isolation, we have developed the following plan. This plan offers remote learning opportunities whilst also acknowledging that some households have limited access to devices and would require hard-copies of work and resources.

This plan will be applied in the following instances:

- 1. An individual is self-isolating because of a positive test within the household;
- 2. A group of children are self-isolating because of a case of coronavirus in the bubble;
- 3. A whole bubble or cohort is self-isolating because of an outbreak of coronavirus;
- 4. School is only open to key worker children and vulnerable children with all others learning from home.

The plan complies with the expectations and principles outlined in the DFE document <u>Guidance for Full Opening of Schools</u> and DfE guidance '<u>Remote Education Support</u>'.

Software and online platforms

Within all plans, teachers will set appropriate work in-line with our current curriculum, primarily supplemented by a range of resources provided by Oak Academy and White Rose Maths.

Children will remain in contact with their class teacher through Microsoft Teams and Class Dojo (to share successes and communications).

Oak Academy has been selected to support remote learning for a number of reasons. The Oak Academy lessons are in-line with our teaching ethos – they encourage the use of retrieval practice, explicit teaching with high quality modelling, and the use of deliberate practice. The online lessons are free to all and offer a recorded taught session so that the children can access physical teaching from a teacher and then access work relating to that lesson within the same website. There are also hundreds of lessons specifically aimed at children with SEND needs and requiring additional support.

White Rose Maths resources will be used as they are matched to our current maths curriculum model. Children are very used to seeing these resources.

TT Rockstars will also be utilised to support the acquisition and retention of basic core skills for children from Year 2-6.

Microsoft Teams will support school in offering online learning with the opportunity for the children to communicate with their teacher through live video.

Class Dojo will remain in use as the communication element has already proved to be invaluable during lockdown between March and July. Teachers and parents will be able to message one another to share information and offer support. The Class Story will offer the chance for teachers to celebrate children's work and maintain our school community.

In the event of any form of isolation and loss of learning caused by Coronavirus, parents must understand that engagement in home learning is compulsory, as is the expectation that St Benedict Biscop CE Primary School makes that provision available and accessible to all. However, if children themselves are too ill to attend then they should not be expected to engage in home learning.



In preparation for home-learning, parents and children need to receive logins and passwords for the following platforms (likewise teaching staff need to be familiar with them):

- Class Dojo
- TT Rockstars
- Microsoft Teams

Worksheets and Practical Resources

If a child is isolated from school i.e. the child is sent home from school to either receive a test or self-isolate as someone in the household is being tested, they will leave school with a pack of work. Children will have immediate opportunity to continue their learning.

The work packs will include basic skills work that would be relevant at any stage of the year i.e. arithmetic, spelling, reading, writing (with a visual prompt) and handwriting.

In the event of extended time at home for some children, parents can request physical copies of resources which can be collected from the school office or posted to the home address.

Remote Learning

The initial response to any isolation will be to provide children with home learning materials (which may need to be delivered). In the case of whole cohort isolation, resources will be uploaded to the school website in the Class Handouts section and priority children will have packs delivered. This measure will afford teachers a short time to prepare their remote learning resources.

For non-core lessons, resources will be uploaded to the school website and Class Dojo. Where possible web-links to appropriate support materials will be shared. This will often be through Oak National using lessons that link to our curriculum. Teachers will schedule an afternoon Teams meeting to support those children needing additional input. There will be an additional end of day Teams meeting so that the class teacher or TA can complete a reading for pleasure session. Teachers will identify which children do not have access to printers or devices suitable for online learning. Those children that need additional support following feedback are to be directed to the Teams meeting for further support with attendance expected.	
In the event of teachers becoming ill, support staff will be asked to 'takeover' the Microsoft Teams account with appropriate resources from White Rose Maths and Oak National Academy being identified by the SLT.

The Class teacher will teach live lessons simultaneously to children of key workers in school and through Microsoft Teams for children working remotely. They will sometimes record their input or share links to appropriate lessons from White Rose Maths or Oak National lessons if this is more appropriate to support learners. The work set for children attending school physically and those attending remotely will be the same to ensure equality of access.

Teachers will be accessible to children through Teams meetings at a minimum of three times a day – am and pm so that any issues or re-teaching can be delivered live. Teaching assistants will also access the Teams live lessons so that they can support children should this be required.

For non-core lessons, resources will be uploaded to the school website and Class Dojo and where possible web-links to appropriate support materials will be shared. This will often be through Oak National using lessons that link to our curriculum. Teachers will schedule an afternoon Teams meeting to support those children needing additional input. There will be an additional end of day Teams meeting so that the class teacher or TA can complete a reading for pleasure session.

Teachers will identify which children do not have access to printers or devices suitable for online learning. For these children physical copies of work will be available for collection or posted to the family home and parents will be asked to send images via Class Dojo to enable feedback to the children.

School has access to a limited number of devices which can be loaned to families where access is an issue to enable children to join live teaching sessions.

Time will also be scheduled for the children to watch a Collective Worship delivered by their class teacher. This will encourage children to keep working, celebrate successes and promote a togetherness alongside our Christian Values.

Completed work should be photographed and uploaded to Class Dojo. Teachers can then review the work completed and ensure that the following day's lesson addresses misconceptions etc. Feedback and queries can take place throughout the day using either Class Dojo or Microsoft Teams chat. Those children that need additional support following feedback are to be directed to a Teams meeting for further support with attendance expected.

In the event of extended school closure teachers will facilitate a weekly wellbeing and socialisation meeting between small groups of children working remotely. This will allow children the time to chat with their peers and discuss any worries in addition to learning support.

Where children would normally receive additional support from SEND agencies, the SENDCO will make arrangements for those to continue virtually as long as the agencies engage.

The SENDCO will share appropriate Oak National SEND lessons with teachers who will disseminate accordingly.

In the event of teachers becoming ill, support staff will be asked to 'takeover' the Microsoft Teams account
with appropriate resources from White Rose Maths and Oak National Academy being identified by the SLT.
